NIKOS ORDOULIDIS

Nikos Ordoulidis has introduced new ways of approaching popular music, which he has integrated into his teaching at the School of Popular and Traditional Music, Technological Educational Institute of Epirus. Dr THEODOROS ANAGNOSTOPOULOS

Dr Theo Anagnostopoulos is a geneticist and a science communicator. His pioneering work on the public understanding of science has helped establish the field of science communication and combat scientific illiteracy in Greece and Cyprus, reaching more than 150,000 young people and professionals. He is the co-founder of the social enterprise SciCo, as well as School Lab, and the Athens, Thessaloniki, Patras and Mediterranean Science Festivals among other science education programmes/platforms. Theo's vision is to combat scientific illiteracy at an international level and help spread S.T.E.M education as a means of empowerment. Studying science for his BSc, MSc and PhD degrees at the University of Newcastle, Imperial College London and King's College London respectively helped Theo develop a rational way of thinking.



ALEXANDRA CHOLI

Alexandra Choli is a pioneer in social innovation in Greece and a leading expert in early stage technology entrepreneurship in Europe. She is founder and Executive Director of Metavallon, a nonnurturina profit organisation early-stage entrepreneurship.
