GEORGIA PAIZI Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance

Georgia Paizi is a movement practitioner, teacher and choreographer. Her work evolves around relational choreography, organic learning for performing arts and consent. In addition to providing the highest quality of technical training, Georgia believes that her UK education set the standards for the inclusive and safe environment for training and creating that she is now actively contributing to in Greece. Konstantinos has won a Global Student Entrepreneur Award and has also been awarded by the National Bank of Greece. He has featured in Forbes 30 Under 30 Greece in recognition of his innovative solution to a crucial problem. Konstantinos attributes his success to his UK education, which he believes has equipped him with excellent critical analysis skills. He plans to expand his AI financial tools solution for young adults throughout Europe. Konstantinos holds a Bachelor of Science in Business Management from Cardiff University.





SCIENCE AND SUSTAINABILITY AWARD



Dr FREIDERIKI MICHAILIDOU University of St Andrews

Dr Freideriki Michailidou is a scientist and entrepreneur who has developed sustainable processes for creating fragrant materials, impacting the food, pharma, agrochemical and advanced materials industries. As part of her research, she led an expedition to Mount Olympus, Greece's highest mountain, to collect volatile emissions from rare, protected plants. Using cutting-edge analytical technology, she not only identified the molecular structures contributing to the unique scents of these plants, but her research is also paving the way for the protection of the biodiversity and flora of Greece. She credits her UK education for laying the foundation for her dedication to innovation in the sustainable formulation of fragrances. Her UK education also provided her with mentorship, support and a focus on gender equality, which fostered her commitment to female empowerment in STEM. She aspires to start her own company and envisions advising businesses on sustainable fragrance practices, fostering innovation and contributing to ongoing research. Freideriki holds a Doctor of Philosophy in Chemistry from the University of St Andrews.



Dr FOTIOS PELESIS Swansea University (Prifysgol Abertawe)

Dr Fotios Pelesis works as the Plant Continuous Improvement Manager for a Cenergy Holdings S.A. subsidiary where he leads the Operational Excellence Programme. Among his achievements is the implementation of a state-of-the-art digital twin technology, a global innovation in the steel pipe industry. For his accomplishments, he has won two Silver Manufacturing Excellence Awards. Fotios credits his worldclass engineering knowledge to his UK education, which provided him with access to funding and leading laboratories that played a key role in his breakthrough PhD results.
