PANAGIOTIS KYRIAKOPOULOS Strathclyde Business School

Panagiotis Kyriakopoulos is the lead international technological park expert in a series of research activities that assist entrepreneurs, at different stages of their journey, to internationalise. Panagiotis' research has been instrumental in generating an enabling entrepreneurial ecosystem in the field of technology parks that fosters networking and innovation. Panagiotis feels that his UK education has provided him with excellent analytical and communication skills, the ability to work well individually and with others, and the ability to seek and critically evaluate material from different sources, showing originality of thought and expression. He is now using his expertise to advise the Hellenic War Museum on how to create an Innovation Museum within the new technological parks in Athens and Thessaloniki. Dr ARISTEA KYRIAKOU University of Aberdeen

Aristea Kyriakou leads an outdoor education start-up that aspires to literally bring fresh air to schools in Greece and abroad. Aristea's project, Greek and Green, was built on the foundations laid during her studies in the UK, Europe and Greece. It has already attracted more than 15,000 followers worldwide. Aristea feels that her UK education has made her the person she is today. Her day-to-day dealings with her supervisors, colleagues and a vibrant interdisciplinary academic community, as well as the natural campus environment, have essentially determined the way she manages her project today and how she sees the future of education. She is now developing Greek and Green as a proposal of what a more ecocentric education system might look like should society decide to make a positive impact on the environment starting from school communities. MARIA NEFELI CHATZIIOANNIDOU University of Northampton

Maria Nefeli Chatziioannidou is a social entrepreneur and founder of the social enterprise Great Women. This is the first online women's community in Greece that aims to empower women, raise awareness of society's problems and motivate women to participate in activities that have a positive impact on society. In its third year of operation, it is now a community of more than 145,000 members. Maria Nefeli believes that her UK education experience has helped her reach her full potential by allowing her to explore her strengths and equipping her with the skills and knowledge needed to deal with complicated problems. Her aim is to focus on actions that will create equal opportunities for all women in Greece. Maria Nefeli holds a Master of Arts in Social Innovation from the University of Northampton.

PANAYIOTIS CONSTANTINIDES University of Glasgow

Panayiotis Constantinides has been teaching English for more than 30 years and has been a licensed dyslexia evaluator since 2012. He is the founder of the online community Dyslexia Greece, which now counts more than 1,400 teachers. In recent years, he has delivered presentations and teacher training workshops on Dyslexia in English language teaching, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Learning Difficulties in Greece, Europe and the UK. Panayiotis chose to pursue postgraduate studies in the UK as he considers it to be a country with a track record of developments in the field of dyslexia and learning disability. He believes that the assistance and support he received during his studies, have helped him expand his knowledge and ultimately assist parents, teachers and students in Greece and Europe. He aims to further develop his skills by joining the Dyslexia and Adults project at the Dyslexia Institute UK. and to train teachers to become more confident in the field of dyslexia and dyslexia-friendly methods. Panayiotis holds a Master of Education in Inclusive Education: Research, Policy and Practice, with a Specialism in Dyslexia, from the University of Glasgow.



VICKY PROTOPAPADAKI University of Edinburgh

Vicky Protopapadaki is co-founder and Scientific and Administrative Officer of the MA in Animal Welfare, Ethics and Law (MA AWEL), a postgraduate programme offered jointly by the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens and the Hellenic Pasteur Institute. This programme fills a gap in Greek higher education by addressing important aspects of our relationship with animals in an effort to improve the status of animals. Her UK education inspired Vicky and was instrumental in the design of the postgraduate programme as it gave her the opportunity to experience an exemplary educational paradigm in animal welfare, which she tries to implement in her work. She intends to pursue a Doctor of Philosophy in animal welfare with the goal of helping to improve people's attitudes towards animals. Vicky holds a Master of Science in Applied Animal Behaviour and Animal Welfare, from The University of Edinburgh.
