**Dr EVANGELIA BALATSOU**The University of Edinburgh

Dr Evangelia (Lilian) Balatsou is a Cognitive Neuroscientist, an Artificial Intelligence (AI) Evangelist and the founder of Greek Girls Code. She holds a PhD in Cognitive Neuroscience and works in the artificial intelligence industry. Her scientific rigour inspired her to found Greek Girls Code to help educate young women in Greece about the benefits of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) skills. Lilian's transformative career journey is highly influenced by her UK education, which equipped her with important skills in the area of STEM, transformed her expertise in interdisciplinary fields and taught her the importance of community and equity in education. Lilian's vision is to create an ecosystem of solidarity, interdisciplinarity and mentorship in the STEM fields for all women and marginalised communities in Greece. Lilian holds a Master of Science in Psychology of Language from the University of Edinburgh and a Doctor of Philosophy in Psychology (Cognitive Neuroscience) from Bangor University.



NOTIS PARASKEVOPOULOS
