PANAYIOTIS CONSTANTINIDES University of Glasgow

He is the founder of the online community Dyslexia_Greece, which now counts more than 1,400 teachers. In recent years, he has delivered presentations and teacher training workshops on Dyslexia in English language teaching, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Learning Difficulties in Greece, Europe and the UK. Panayiotis chose to pursue postgraduate studies in the UK as he considers it to be a country with a track record of developments in the field of dyslexia and learning disability. He believes that the assistance and support he received during his studies, have helped him expand his knowledge and ultimately assist parents, teachers and students in Greece and Europe. He aims to further develop his skills by joining the Dyslexia and Adults project at the Dyslexia Institute UK, and to train teachers to become more confident in the field of dyslexia and dyslexia-friendly methods. Panaviotis holds a Master of Education in Inclusive Education: Research, Policy and Practice, with a Specialism in Dyslexia, from the University of Glasgow.
