

## **Primary Plus 1 Syllabus**

In this level, students will:

- develop core skills in collaboration and communication, creativity and imagination, digital literacy, critical thinking and problem solving, and citizenship.
- watch Shaun the Sheep animations in each magazine.
- read texts including comic strips, descriptions, a story, a party invitation, and a leaflet.
- listen to audio passages including presentations, instructions, directions, birthday wishes, a weather report, and an interview.
- listen to and sing songs.
