CHOOSING YOUR UK EXPERIENCE

The UK offers a variety of student experiences:

- London: Fast-paced, multicultural city but higher living costs.
- Southern England (Bristol, Exeter, Brighton): Milder weather, creative and relaxed atmosphere.
- Northern England (Manchester, Leeds, Newcastle): Vibrant student life, friendly cities, lower living costs, cooler climate.
- Scotland (Edinburgh, Glasgow), Wales (Cardiff, Swansea),
 Northern Ireland (QUB, Ulster): Rich in history and natural beauty. Living costs vary.


Consider smaller campuses vs. large city universities. Smaller cities are more community-focused, while London is more international but expensive.






ACCOMODATION AND COST OF LIVING

- Types of Accommodation:
 - Halls of residence (first-year students, social atmosphere).
 - Private housing (shared flats or houses, more independence).
- Costs Vary by City: London is the most expensive; northern cities and Wales/Scotland are cheaper.
- Utilities & Expenses: Bills may not be included in private accommodation—budgeting is important.
- UK Housing: Central heating is essential; houses may feel colder than in Greece.
- Timelines: Depending on your location, you may need to secure housing early on, so check information from your university and be proactive.



FOOD, SHOPPING AND EVERYDAY LIFE

- **Supermarkets**: UK has a mix of budget (Aldi, Lidl) and premium (Waitrose, M&S) stores. Cities will also have a selection of international food shops.
- Public Transport: Buses are the main transport in most cities. Some cities, like London, have subways or undergrounds. Walking and cycling are common.
- Shops Close Early: Unlike Greece, most shops (except big supermarkets) close by 6-7 pm.
- Independence & Self-Sufficiency: Students often move out at 18 and manage their own cooking, cleaning, and budgeting.



STUDYING AND UNIVERSITY SUPPORT

- Teaching Style: More independent learning, with a mix of lectures, seminars, and assignments.
- **Assessment**: Essays, coursework, and exams: less emphasis on oral exams than in Greece.
- University Support: Mental health, academic writing, and career services available.
- Work Opportunities: Part-time jobs are common (up to 20 hours per week on a student visa).


